Autumn events from the **Poetry Society** include a special focus on the **First World War**. Four of the UK's most exciting poets premiere searing new commissions responding to the legacy of the conflict in **The Pity** at the Purcell Room at Queen Elizabeth Hall, London. **Memory & Memorialisation**, a partnership with the Freud Museum, is a psychoanalytic poetry day-festival examining subjects suggested by the war through readings, talks and conversations with leading poets and psychoanalysts.

The theme for this year's National Poetry Day is 'Remember', which will be reflected in our annual free poetry showcase,
